
Enhance the voice of specific populations regarding mental health service needs:



Three-year contracts


Each contract is \$670,000 per year

Three-year contract total is \$2,010,000

# **Immigrant and Refugee Advocacy**

#### In 2018:

- The legislature approved advocacy funding for Immigrant and Refugee populations.
- The Commission conducted four listening sessions:
  - Los Angeles
  - San Diego
  - Alameda
  - Sacramento
- Collected over 50 surveys




## **What We Heard**

- Fund local programs
- Trust is key
- Grassroots organizations are often overlooked
- Local organizations are uniquely situated



## Request for Proposals (RFP)

- RFP released in January 2019
- 24 applications received
- One local advocacy organization would be selected from each of the five regions
  - \$402,000 to each organization
  - Three-year contract
